Reception team

We have created a reception call hub at our Redbourn surgery so all our reception team can work closely together. We believe this will help them share their knowledge when it comes to signposting patients effectively as well as it being easier for them to communicate between each other. There will be a receptionist based at the front desk of each surgery for walk in patients and to cover any prescription requests and daily tasks. This is already having a positive change on the number of calls we are answering, and we can see our wait times steadily reducing.

Monday mornings are always extremely busy so we would like to remind our patients that if your call is not urgent, please could you call at a later time.

Senior Clinical Administration Team

This is a new team that has been created to work closely with our doctors. Administration is something that takes a lot of valuable time away from our GPs, time which could be used more effectively on patient care.

Our senior clinical administration team (SCA Team) will now be learning and taking over some of the administration work that falls to them liaising with patients, secretaries and hospitals on behalf of our clinical teams.

This is a brand-new role currently with a team of 3. Welcome to Katie, Kate and Hayley. As the team settles in, we look forward to seeing how their role will evolve.




A Gentle Reminder
